Secondly make a small whole at the top palm of your hand for your ribbon to go through to create a loop. Thread your ribbon through the hole and secure.

Paper Plate Santa



What you need:

Paper Plate
Red Paint/Peach Paint/Colours
Cotton Wool
Black Felt Tip
Glue

Instructions:

Firstly take your paper plate and paint Santa's red hat along the outside of the plate bringing the paint down slightly on one side and leave to dry. Next paint the peach skin colour to the paper plate just underneath the Santa hat leave to dry.



Once your plate is dry, glue your Santa beard and bobble at the end of his hat and the line just poking out of his hat to replicate his hair.

Lastly add your red nose and two eyes and there you have your very own Santa plate.
