What you need:

Lollypop stick

Pipe Cleaner

Beads

Glue

Different small objects you can attach to your lollypop stick to fidget with.

Instructions:

Simply attach your small fidget objects to your pipe cleaner, threading them through.

Glue the pipe cleaner to the lollypop stick.

What you need:

Jelly

Instructions:

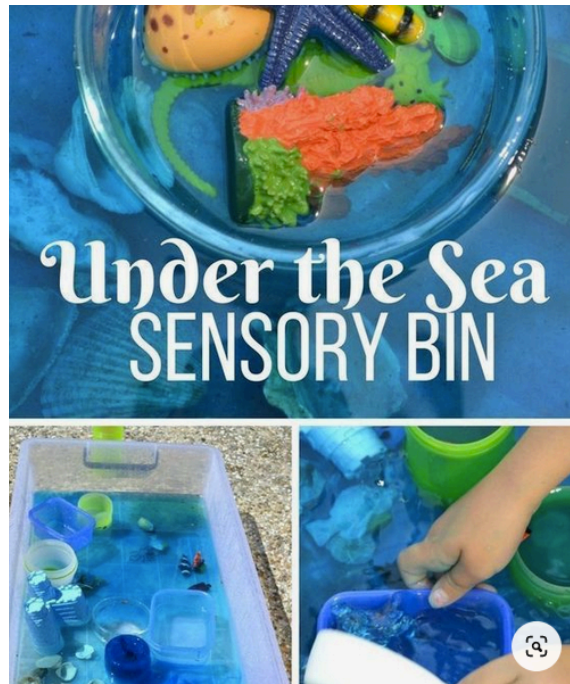
Add your small toys into the jelly

Under the Sea Sensory Bin



What you need:

Under the sea toys

Hair Gel

Radox

Shaving Foam

Blue Food Colouring

Instructions:

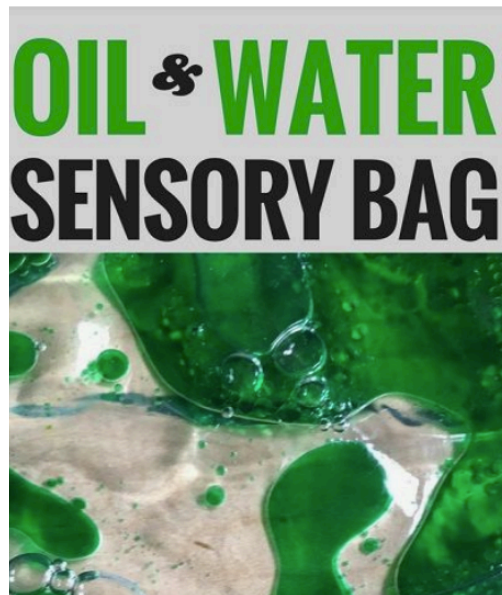
Using a large container, add your blue hair gel, I have added extra products above but you can make it simple and choose just one or two.

Making sure you don't have an allergies to any of the products if so, change it up to blue jelly or water with blue food colouring.

After adding your gel, then add some radox.

With the shaving foam you can make waves, by squirting small amounts make wavy strips, and then add food colouring, using something to swish the food colouring around making waves. Add your fun under water toys, if you have some play sand or even brown rice you can create some sand. Enjoy!

Oil and Water Sensory Bag



What you need:

Large Freezer Bags

Baby Oil

Water

Food Colouring

Duct Tape

Instructions:

Using the duct tape, tape the three closed sides of the freezer bag, to make it extra secure.

Place the tape on half of the bag and fold it over to the other side. I suggest doing the sides first and then the bottom.

Once your tape is in place, it's time to put the bag together.

Start with your baby oil, use about 1/4 of a cup of oil.

Then drip in some of your food colouring.

Then add some water. About 1/4 of a cup of water.

Seal the bag, pushing out most of the air. I would leave a small pocket of air in this sensory bag- but not enough that it could potentially pop.

Tape up the open edge of the bag and it's ready to play!

Marbled Milk Paper



What you need:

Container/Paper Plate

Milk

Food Colouring

Cotton Bud

Instructions:

Add milk to your container or paper plate, enough to cover the bottom surface.

Drop blobs of food colouring in the milk, leaving gaps in between.

Using a cotton bud, start moving the food colouring around, it will create a marble effect pattern.
