

Plate Dinosaur Craft



What you need

Paper Plate

Paint/Colours

Card

Glue

Pegs

Pencil

Instructions

Using your paper plate cut them in half.

Colour or paint that half of your plate. Front and back. If you have pegs paint or colour them too, if you don't any other material would work. Wait for it to dry before following next steps.

With remaining parts of the other plate, make the spikey back.

To create the head draw and outline onto card and then carefully cut, add eyes a mouth and then stick to your dinosaurs' body.

Lastly attach your dinosaur feet.

Toilet Roll Heroes



What you need

Toilet Rolls

Paint

Pencil

Glue

Card

Instructions

Using your toilet roll holder start drawing out your superhero design.

With your paper or card, draw out a cape for the heroes and a jacket for 'The Joker'. Cut them out if they are not the colour you want paint or colour, leave to one side for now.

Once you are happy with your designs on the toilet rolls, start painting or colouring, be very careful to stay in the lines and let sections dry between painting, section by section.

When you are finished painting all the design, leave to dry completely and then using your glue add the cape/jacket.

Shaving Foam & Water bead Craft

Shaving Foam

Water Beads

Pretend Snow



What you need

Baking Soda

White Hair Conditioner

Container

Mix 2 1/2 cups of pure baking soda with 1/2 a cup of white hair conditioner and you have hours of sensory play. It really is THAT simple. You can add more baking soda as you wish to make your “snow” less wet if you’d like. If you need to make a larger batch of snow you can easily multiply this recipe.

Ninja Stress Balls



**HOW TO MAKE
NINJA STRESS BALLS**



What you need

Balloons – white or yellow for the face, and other colours for the
ninja mask

Scissors

Sandwich Bags

Flour or play dough

Ballpoint pen

Instructions

Fill a sandwich bag with 3/4 cup of flour (or play dough). Filling a sandwich bag is SO much easier than trying to stuff a balloon with flour!

Fold over the baggie and squeeze out all the air. Cut the blowing end off of a white balloon so that you are left with a round balloon with a hole.

Stuff the bag filled with flour or play dough into the balloon.

Cut off the blowing end of another balloon. Cut an opening for the ninja face. Then, stretch this balloon over the white balloon with the opening facing the opposite way (so that the flour bag can't come out). Add a ninja face with a ballpoint pen the face still looks great even after lots of handling.
