



Toilet Roll Spiders



What you need:

Toilet Roll

Paint

Card

Googly Eyes

Scissors

Tape/Glue

Instructions:

Take your toilet roll and cut it in half.

Paint and decorate your toilet roll like a spider using whichever coloured paint you prefer (leave it to dry) then add a face and googly eyes.

Lastly using your card cut out eight legs bending for the knee and folding up at the bottom for the feet, then attach with glue or tape to the underneath of your spider.

Ocean Sensory Tray



What you need:

Blue Gelibaff

Sand

Sea Creatures

Instructions:

Using a tray follow the instructions of the gelibaff, you can buy this online from amazon; it is a great product for the base of a sensory tray, with it only being a small surface area you want to cover you won't need to use the whole pack so you can get a lot more use out of it. When you have created your mixture pour into a bigger tray.

Add your sand, if you don't have any sand brown rice can create the same effect.

It's time to put your sea creatures into the tray; this is a great way for your children to explore through imaginative play.

Lollypop Stick Frame



What you need:

Lollypop Sticks

Items to decorate

Peg

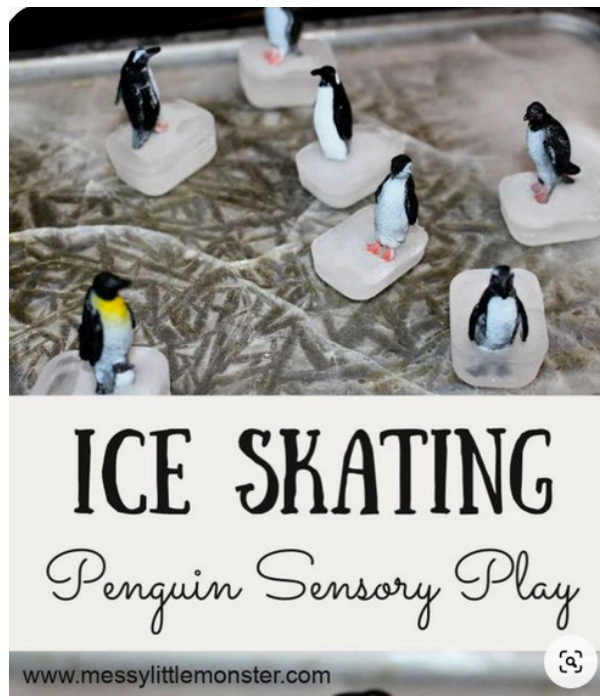
Glue

Instructions:

This lovely little DIY photo frame idea is great to create little memories in. Measure up how many lollypop sticks to create a frame for your photo, once you are happy stick them together and leave to dry. Add the decoration you want to your photo frame, it could be

glitter, buttons, pompoms. Then the finishing touch add your peg by attaching it to the photo and then to the frame. If you don't want to use a peg simply stick your photo to the frame.

Ice Skating Penguins



What you need:

Water

Ice Tray

Small Penguins

Baking Tray

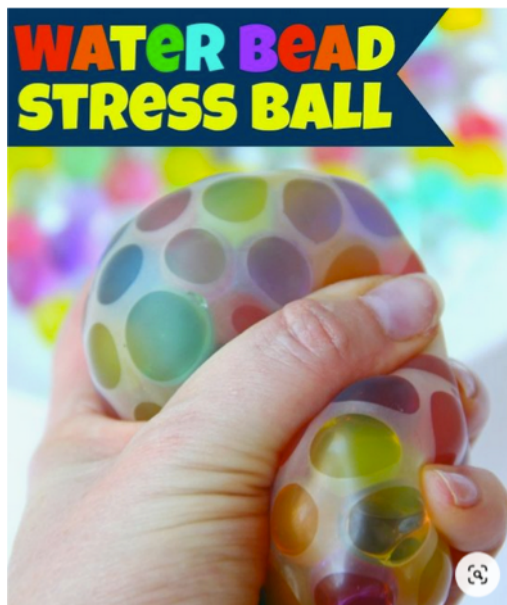
Instructions:

You will need to plan ahead a little with this sensory play activity, as you will need time for your ice to freeze! Setting up ice activities with the children is great so they can see the change that takes place as their water turns to ice.

Begin by filling a baking tray and an ice cube tray with water and then add penguins to the ice cube tray and then put them in the freezer.

It can take a bit of patience to get all the animals standing up in their ice! The best way to do this was to freeze a little water first, then add the penguins and a little more water before refreezing them. Take the baking tray and ice cube tray out of the freezer and carefully press the ice cubes with penguins on out of the ice cube tray. The baking tray full of water will be your ice rink and the penguins stuck to ice cubes are ready for skating!

Water Bead Stress Ball



What you need:

Water beads packet (.35 ounce)

8 Ounces empty water bottle.

2-3 clear balloons

Scissors

Instructions

Prepare water beads according to instructions on packet. Drain.

Fill the water bottle with beads.

Blow up one of the balloons and place it over the top of the bead-filled bottle.

Turn the water bottle upside down, shake and squeeze the bottle until all of the water beads have been transferred from the bottle to the balloon.

Tie the end of the balloon and *cut the larger tie off the end of the balloon.

Repeat the steps with the other balloon(s).
