



Moston Fields Primary School Accessibility Plan

1. This Accessibility Plan has been drawn up in consultation with the staff and governors of the school and will be ratified by governors at the meeting in September 2023.
2. We are committed to providing a fully accessible environment which values and includes all pupils, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotional and cultural needs. We are committed to challenging negative attitudes about disability and accessibility and to developing a culture of awareness, tolerance and inclusion
3. Moston Fields Primary School, plans over time, to continue to increase the accessibility of provision for all pupils, staff and visitors to the school. The Accessibility Plan will contain relevant actions to:
 - further develop the school environment to support physical needs adding specialist facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access education.
 - Increase access to the curriculum for pupils with a disability, expanding the curriculum as necessary to ensure that pupils with a disability are as equally, prepared for life as are the able-bodied pupils; (If a school fails to do this they are in breach of the DDA).
 - This covers teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of the school such as participation in after-school clubs, leisure and cultural activities or school visits. It also covers the provision of specialist aids and equipment, which may assist these pupils in accessing the curriculum. Improve

the delivery of written information to pupils, staff, parents and visitors with disabilities. Examples might include handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about the school and school events. The information should be made available in various preferred formats within a reasonable time frame.

4. Below is our Action Plan, relating to these key aspects of accessibility. This plan will be reviewed and adjusted on an annual basis or as required.
5. We acknowledge that there is a need for ongoing awareness raising and training for staff and governors in the matter of disability discrimination and the need to inform attitudes on this matter.
6. The Accessibility Plan should be read in conjunction with the following policies, strategies and documents: Equality objectives, Health & Safety (including off-site safety) SEND Policy, Behaviour Policy, School Improvement Plan, and the school's statement of ethos and values.
7. The Action Plan for physical accessibility relates to current and projected needs and funding.
8. As curriculum policies are reviewed, a section relating to access will be added to that on Equality and Diversity.
9. The School Website will feature the Accessibility Plan under 'Policies'.
12. The Plan will be monitored through the Health, Safety and Premises Committees of the Governors.
13. The Plan may be monitored by Ofsted as part of their inspection cycle. The school meets the requirements of the Disability Equality Scheme.
